### a message from the board chair

Bay Countians are thankful for having survived the catastrophic impact of Hurricane Michael on October 10, 2018. Immediately we embraced the mantra **#850Strong**. Emerging from the debris after the storm, we went to work searching for our neighbors, clearing our streets and working to rebuild our homes, businesses and churches...literally, to rebuild our lives. This organization, Rebuild Bay County, Inc., is one of the innumerable changes to our community landscape.

In March 2019, I addressed a gathering on the steps of the state Capitol in Tallahassee, saying The Panama City-Bay County communities are resilient... but in the face of catastrophic damage from a Cat 5 storm—we are not okay. Yeah, I know the weather people haven't declared it a Cat 5, but those of us who lived through it have determined that it was a Cat 5, perhaps even a Cat 6. Yes, we are alive and thankful...But we are not okay.

Well, there's no such rating as a Cat 6 Hurricane, but the rating for Michael was soon upgraded to a Cat 5 Storm. Between November 2018 and April 2019, Rebuild Bay County, Inc., was organized and represented more than 70 organizations. We knew that we needed to come together to reflect and muster energy to continue, so on the 6-month anniversary of Hurricane Michael, Rebuild Bay led a community ecumenical service "Pray for Bay" at Tommy Oliver Stadium. Six months out, then Bay County Commissioner Griff Griffitts described the situation as "purgatory...somewhere between heaven and hell." There was still so much cleanup and debris removal yet to be done. FEMA estimated that it would take us 5-7 years to return to normal.


On the first anniversary and the third anniversary, Rebuild Bay held commemorative events to acknowledge our collective journey to restoration. At year five, we are much better but not yet wholly restored. Tattered tarps are on some homes, building frames stand empty and who knows how many people are still renovating their home interiors. And Rebuild Bay County, Inc., under the leadership of Executive Director USAF Col. (ret.) Donna Pilson, has been a key

factor in helping hundreds of citizens get the help they need to rebuild. But overall, we can now say that we are okay...having come from #850Strong to #850Resilient.




\* Total Revenue does not include outstanding reimbursements at time of report





### **Home Repairs**

Disasters ravage homes and leave residents struggling to return to a safe, stable and sustainable environment. **\$10,000** can provide those last construction materials and supplies homeowners need to complete their repairs and recovery.

### Food Pantry/Distributions

Donate today to make sure no family goes hungry when disaster strikes by supporting our food pantry and mobile distributions. **\$30 can feed a family of 4 for a week** after disasters of any kind.



### **Emergency Shelter**
